05156 – College Now: Cartooning and Illustration

Prerequisite: Drawing or Intro to Art; Teacher Approval required if not completing prerequisites.

Grade Levels: 9-12

1 Semester

Students will learn the fundamental principles of 2D art and how they apply to sequential art. Composition, movement, pacing, verisimilitude, and more will all be utilized to create convincing renderings, which can be easily followed through a series of illustrations. The class begins with basic lessons in drawing, inking, and layouts. Students will then create single panel, multi-panel illustrations and weekly comic strips. The class culminates in the creation of the student's own graphic novel. **Students may receive "College Now" credit for this class through Lane Community College.**

05156 – Drawing

Grade Levels: 9-12

1 Semester

This is an introductory course in drawing. Students will learn various pencil drawing techniques and principles that will be utilized in all other art classes. This course covers basic drawing, perspective, composition, landscape, and the figure. This is the perfect class for students who have little or NO experience with visual art, as-well-as those who wish to advance their skills.

Students may receive “College Now” credit for this class. Students wishing to do so must complete this course and Independent Study Drawing with an A or B.

05197 - College Now: Independent Study Drawing (IS)

Prerequisite: One Stand-Alone Course – Teacher Approval

Grade Levels: 10-12

1 Semester

Students, who complete the prerequisites with a “B” or better and have instructor permission, will have the option to further their knowledge in Drawing, Ceramics, or Cartooning. Students in IS-Drawing and IS-Cartooning will supply their own materials in addition to creating their own curriculum. There is a lab fee for when taking IS-Ceramics.

College NOW – Students completing Independent Studies in Drawing or Ceramics are eligible for college credit. Please speak with your instructor about this option. These credits are free of charge, so please take advantage of this opportunity.

05162 - College Now: Graphic Design

Prerequisites: Drawing

Grades 9-12

1 Semester

This is an introductory course in graphic design. Students will study the elements of design and create projects utilizing those elements. Students will create both traditional handcrafted and digital projects including illustrations, advertisements, signs, and more. **Students may receive college credit for this class.**

**05612AD- Advanced
Graphic Design**

Prerequisites: Graphic

Design **Instructor**

Approval

Grades 10-12

1 Semester

This course applies the techniques and principles learned both in drawing and graphic design to real world designs. In addition to learning Adobe Illustrator and Corel Draw, students will develop designs for actual clients. Students will learn to communicate effectively with clients, supervisors, other designers on their team, and technicians, through every stage of . development, design, and production. Any student wanting to participate in this course needs to be highly motivated, have good self-management and time management skills, and have a strong work ethic.

05189- Intro to Art

Grades 9-12

1 Semester

This is an introductory survey course in fine art. Students will explore multiple artistic techniques and media such as drawing, painting, ceramics, calligraphy, sculpture, and more. Beginning art students will be able to sample a variety of art forms before taking the regular courses.

Advanced students will get the opportunity to work with techniques that do not normally fit into the regular courses.
