



Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2018-19 graduating in 2021-22.




School Goals

Students earning a high school diploma or GED within five years. Cohort Includes students who were firsttime ninth graders in 2017-18 finishing in 2021-22.




State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% ontime, four year graduation rate by 2027. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.







About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

At CHS, students are provided the opportunity to take a wide variety of advanced honors/AP courses and to earn dual credit through partnerships with local college and university programs. These rigorous courses allow students to explore areas of academic interest and promote college and career readiness.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

CHS provides students with multiple CTE pathways and courses of study, including Business Management and Administration, Health Occupations, Construction Technology, Visual Arts/Graphic Design, Agriculture, and Welding/Manufacturing Technology. These courses allow students to gain practical skills and experience while preparing them for future careers.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES
